Regulatory highlights

KIGALI



Kigali Amendment ratified

On 11 March 2021, Türkiye approved the Kigali Amendment to the Montreal Protocol. The ratification came into effect on 10 November 2021.

Updated F-gas regulation implemented

Türkiye has prepared legislation to reduce the consumption of ozone depleting substances (ODS) and HFCs as well as the general demand for cooling while increasing energy efficiency.



MEPS and building codes aligned with EU standards



Türkiye has also prepared several minimum energy performance standards (MEPS) for appliances and building codes; as an EU candidate country, Türkiye is working to fully harmonize MEPS with EU standards.

Regulatory recommendations


NDC support

Support national cooling plan
